What is a MEDIUM?

A MEDIUM is what the art is made out of!

Clay, paper, stone, gumballs, paint, lasers, wire, pipecleaners, wax, glass, tires, lint, cars, bicycles, fingernails, marble, rubberbands, graphite, mirrors, wood, dirt, computers, jelly, silk, cardboard, oil, bronze, fresco, acrylic, etc., etc., etc.....

KNOW YOUR TERMS!

- Knowing a few key terms will help you sound really convincing!
- Art Form: Category of art making, describes the act of making art
- Art Style: Grouping <u>similar looking art</u> into a category
- Art Movement: A <u>specific time in history</u> where enough people have the same philosophy or style

It works like this...

A painter uses ACRYLIC PAINT as their <u>MEDIUM</u>
Their ART <u>FORM</u> is PAINTING

The same painter paints abstract pictures

- Their ART <u>STYLE</u> IS ABSTRACT
- The "ABSTRACT EXPRESSIONISM" <u>MOVEMENT</u> occurred post WWII.
- BUT...Not all painters that consider themselves "abstract artists" were involved in the abstract expressionist movement...

Aesthetics

Branch of philosophy Art is an EXPERIENCE Principles regarding how to determine beauty

A philosophy of an abstract expressionist...

When I am *in* my painting, I'm not aware of what I'm doing. It is only after a sort of 'get acquainted' period that I see what I have been about. I have no fear of making changes, destroying the image, etc., because the painting has a life of its own. I try to let it come through. It is only when I lose contact with the painting that the result is a mess. Otherwise there is pure harmony, an easy give and take, and the painting comes out well. —Jackson Pollock, *My Painting*, 1956

A philosophy of street art...

The Andre The Giant sticker was just a spontaneous, happy accident. I was teaching a friend how to make stencils in the summer of 1989, and I looked for a picture to use in the newspaper, and there just happened to be an ad for wrestling with Andre The Giant and I told him that he should make a stencil of it. He said 'Nah, I'm not making a stencil of that, that's stupid!' but I thought it was funny so I made the stencil and I made a few stickers and the group of guys I was hanging out with always called each other The Posse, so it said Andre The Giant Has A Posse, and it was sort of appropriated from hip-hop slang -Public Enemy, NWA and Ice-T were all using the word
